- SUSTAINABILITY** | A commitment to relationships of accountability that steward God’s gifts for the present and future.

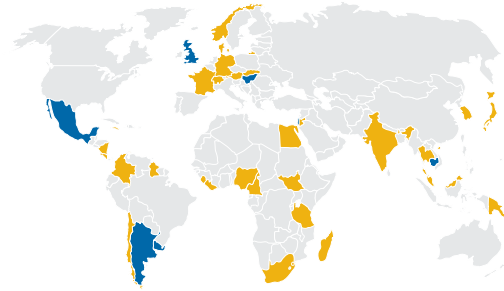

# INTERNATIONAL LEADERS PROGRAM



The International Leaders Program accompanies the ELCA's global companion churches and institutions to equip leaders for mission and ministry in a global context through scholarships and leadership development programming. Altogether, thousands of leaders around the world have been equipped directly by the International Leaders Program. They go on to benefit countless lives through their leadership in church and society, multiplying the impact of the program in their own communities. The ELCA benefits too, receiving the gifts of the global Lutheran church as we live out our commitment to ministry with new, young and diverse people.

In 2025, 182 individuals from 42 countries received scholarship support for academic programs at institutions around the world. An additional 22 young adult leaders from 20 countries served as camp counselors at ELCA camps through the International Camp Counselor program.

# ELCA COMPANION SYNOD PROGRAM

Companion synod relationships of the ELCA connect its synods and congregations with Lutheran churches throughout the world. These relationships are concrete expressions of the ELCA's communion and fellowship with the more than 140 member churches of the Lutheran World Federation. Each of the 65 ELCA synods has at least one international church companion, and many have additional relationships, for a total of more than 120 companion synod relationships.

These relationships are rooted in accompaniment, which promotes the values of mutuality, inclusivity, vulnerability, empowerment and sustainability. Through the program, companion churches and ELCA synods nurture and strengthen one another for life and ministry through prayer, study, communication, exchange of visitors and sharing of resources.

We are a church that believes God is calling us into the world – together. Companion church relationships enrich and deepen our ministries by exposing us to global challenges and perspectives as we seek to work with one another to build up the body of Christ in the world.



The companion synod program is supported by the churchwide organization through the following strategic priorities:

**COMMUNICATION** – Network meetings and regular communication in coordination with the area desk directors, regional representatives and mission personnel.

**DELEGATIONS** – Small groups traveling to visit companions are supported and encouraged by ELCA staff in the region.

**CONSULTATIONS** – All companions who relate to a region, country or church spend several days engaging in conversation, learning together and revisiting relational agreements.

**EDUCATION** – Continuing development and distribution of resources in the areas of accompaniment and cultural competency.

**GLOBAL GIFTS** – Facilitating the transfer of funds to companion churches and projects through the ELCA Gift Processing Center.
